IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM

All Grade 7 and 8 students are once again being offered three free vac-



cines through the health unit's school immunization program. These vaccines are free only through the school immunization program and not at your family doctor.

These vaccines include: hepatitis B (hep B), human papillomavirus vaccine (HPV) and meningococcal. The clinics for these three vaccines are being scheduled for Grade 7 and 8 students starting this fall.

While all three vaccines are strongly recommended, Meningococcal vaccine is required by law, under the Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA), for school attendance.

More information will be sent home prior to the school clinic for review by parents and students.

Inclement weather and bus cancellation information reminder

All information regarding cancelled buses in MCLEMENT Simcoe County is posted on the Simcoe County Student Transportation Consortium (SCSTC)'s bus information website at



www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca. Our school is in the CENTRAL zone. When buses are cancelled, schools remain open for student learning, unless otherwise noted. School staff are expected to plan for such emergencies in order to transition students who are unable to attend due to inclement weather, to their online platforms (Google Classroom and/or SCDSBhub [Brightspace by D2L]) and continue with academic programming. It is always a family decision whether or not it is safe for their child(ren) to leave for school under severe weather

The Consortium and bus operators try to make the decision to cancel school buses before 6 a.m. and make every effort to post announcements before 7 a.m. Inclement weather cancellations are effective for the whole day and buses cancelled in the morning will not run at the end of the day. School bus transportation information available from the SCSTC

In order to receive delay and cancellation notifications, families can



check the Simcoe County Student Transportation Consortium (SCSTC) website at www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca or download the 'BusPlanner Delays' app from the Apple or Android app stores to receive delay notifications to their devices. Users would need to select Simcoe County STC as the transportation authority. The app will need to be forced closed, but you will be able to select your student(s) routes or school to receive delays. The app will send a general notice for any cancellation in Simcoe County. You only need to know which 'zone' you're in, so you would know which one to look out for in the app. You can find your student's zone by visiting the School Bus Status page at www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca and clicking the dropdown for the area you live in.

Immunization Records

Has your child already received their routine immunizations? As a parent or guardian, **you are required to report your child's immunizations** to your local public health unit if your child attends school.

The following are required immunizations:

- Tetanus, Diphtheria, Polio and Pertussis (whooping cough)
- Measles, Mumps and Rubella—must have two doses after the first birthday
- Meningococcal Disease

The health unit does not receive immunization information directly from doctors' offices. Please update your child's immunization record every time your child receives a vaccine from their health care provider by completing the secure electronic form on our website at smdhu.org/immsonline.

What you can do:

Check—your child's yellow immunization card

Contact—your child's health-care provider to obtain records, or to get missing vaccinations

Share—go to smdhu.org to enter the complete record or fax a completed record to 705-726-3962.

Gifted Screening Process

Students who display an advanced degree of general intellectual ability require additional program support in order to reach their educational potential. This support may

be through enhancing the curriculum, differentiated instruction and through providing program extensions and enrichment.

This type of programming is important to engage, motivate and challenge students who are identified as gifted in either the regular classroom or in gifted classroom placements.

Parents/guardians of a student who will be in or above Grade 3 in this school year, who wish to nominate their child form gifted screening, are asked to contact Mr. Fisher at rfisher@scdsb.on.ca before Wednesday, October 19th.

Students may be nominated by teacher or parent/guardian.

A letter explaining the gifted screening process in greater detail will be sent to parents/guardians of students in Grade 3 at a later date.

Procedures help keep our school safe

The safety and well-being of students is our top priority. We have a number of procedures in place to keep our school safe. You can help your child understand and feel safe by:



- reminding them that emergencies are rare; and,
- telling them it's important to follow staff instructions in these situations.

Parents/guardians should talk about the following emergency drills with their children:

- Shelter in place: a procedure used during hazardous environmental or weather-related situation, where it is necessary to keep all occupants within the school to protect them from an external situation at or near the school. Examples may include chemical spills, blackouts, explosions, or extreme weather conditions.
- Hold and secure: a response to a threat in the general vicinity of a school, but not related to the school. This could be a police pursuit, a crime in progress or an active search by local police for a suspect. All building entrances should be locked to restrict access of unwanted individuals. Generally, school activities may continue as usual inside the building; however, a decision about this will be made by the principal in consultation with the local police services.
- Lockdown: a procedure used in response to a major incident or threat of violence inside the school, or in relation to the school. In this case staff and students are directed to lock themselves in designated safe areas. A lockdown is an emergency response to an imminent threat. Interior doors are locked, lights are shut off and blinds are drawn. Students and staff remain quiet. Schools practice lockdown drills at least two times per year. In the unlikely event of an actual lockdown situation, police ask that parents/guardians do not go to the school. Information will be communicated through the school board social media sites (www.facebook.com/SCDSB and www.twitter.com/SCDSB_Schools), the board website (www.scdsb.on.ca), and through local police and local media.

All schools have evacuation plans in case of gas leaks, bomb threats or fire incidents that would require everyone to leave the school. Each school has two evacuation sites. Ours are Holly Meadows E.S. at 151 Mapleton Avenue and Peggy Hill Rec Centre at 171 Mapleton Avenue. We hold drills to practice our evacuation plan. In a real evacuation, students and staff may go to the evacuation site, depending on the situation. Parents/guardians will be informed about pickup procedures by the school, school board and local media.

When parents/guardians are at school during a drill or emergency event, they must follow direction from school staff, police, fire and/or emergency personnel. Parents/guardians may not have immediate access to their child(ren) during drills or emergencies. They may need to wait until the situation is resolved and school staff and/or emergency personnel release students into parent/guardian care.

It's important for you to know that we will always take whatever precautions are necessary to keep our students and school safe.
