All information regarding cancelled buses in Simcoe County is posted on the Simcoe County Student Transportation Consortium (SCSTC)'s bus information website at:

www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca.



Our school is in the CENTRAL zone. When buses are cancelled, schools remain open **INCLEMENT** for student learning, unless otherwise noted. School staff are expected to plan for such emergencies in order to transition students who are unable to attend due to inclement weather, to their online platforms (Google

Classroom and/or SCDSBhub [Brightspace by D2L]) and continue with academic programming. It is always a family decision whether or not it is safe for their child(ren) to leave for school under severe weather conditions.

The Consortium and bus operators try to make the decision to cancel school buses before 6 a.m. and make every effort to post announcements before 7 a.m. Inclement weather cancellations are effective for the whole day and buses cancelled in the morning will not run at the end of the day. Users would need to select Simcoe County STC as the transportation authority. The app will need to be forced closed, but you will be able to select your student(s) routes or school to receive delays.

The app will send a general notice for any cancellation in Simcoe County. You only need to know which 'zone' you're in, so you would know which one to look out for in the app. You can find your student's zone by visiting the School Bus Status page at www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca and clicking the dropdown for the area you live in.

The Bear Creek Music Programme is offering a music program in which your child is eligible to participate!!

As a high school music teacher, I have had the opportunity to see the benefit that an Instrumental Music programme can provide to students at the Elementary level. Unfortunately, in recent years fewer and fewer students have had these programs available in their Elementary School. For more than 10 years now we have opened up a way for students in Bear Creek's



partner Elementary Schools to obtain these experiences by forming a joint Grade 6-8 band. This year, we will once again be offering this opportunity for students who would like to learn an instrument and play in a band. The band will begin rehearsals towards the end of October. Bear Creek is providing facilities and instruction. The only cost to participants will be the cost of renting the instrument. Instrument rental averages around \$175 for most instruments for the entire school year (full details will be available at the organizational meeting outlined below). All other music will be provided by Bear Creek, on loan for the year.

The organizational meeting for interested students and parents will be held on Tuesday October 17th from 6:30PM – 7:30PM. At the meeting you can get information about the program and ask any questions you might have. I would really like to emphasize the importance of having interested students and a parent at the meeting. Important information will be shared that will help with students' success in the program.

No previous music experience is required to be a part of this ensemble. If you are interested in learning to play a Concert Band instrument (flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, euphonium, tuba, or percussion) then this is your opportunity. To become a part of this ensemble, students and parents are asked to attend the organizational meeting on Tuesday October 17th at 6:30PM in Room 156 at Bear Creek (100 Red Oak Drive).
